
All seam allowances are  ${}^{1}/{}_{4}{}^{"}$  unless otherwise stated. Press seams open unless otherwise stated. WOF = Width of Fabric (selvage to selvage)

LOF = Length of Fabric RST = Right Sides Together

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### Fabric A

Fussy cut four 6  $^{1}/_{2}$ " x LOF strips, centering the fruit motif in the middle as shown below (your strips will be longer). Trim each strip to 6  $^{1}/_{2}$ " x 54  $^{1}/_{2}$ ".



**Fabrics B & C** 

From each fabric cut 1 strip 6  $^{1}/_{2}$ " x WOF

• Subcut 6 squares  $6 \frac{1}{2}$  x  $6 \frac{1}{2}$ 

#### Fabric D

Cut 1 strip 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF

Subcut 3 squares 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"

#### Fabrics E, F, G, & H

From each fabric cut 1 strip 7  $^{1}/_{2}$ " x WOF

• Subcut 2 squares  $7^{1}/_{2}^{"} \times 7^{1}/_{2}^{"}$ 

#### Fabric I

Cut 11 strips 3 1/2" x WOF

- Subcut 124 squares 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
  Cut 2 strips 7 1/1" x WOF
- Cut 2 strips 7 1/2" x WOF
- Subcut 8 squares 7 1/2" x 7 1/2"

Cut 5 strips 2" x WOF

Sew strips together end-to-end and cut two 2" x 54 1/2" side borders and two 2" x 45 1/2" top and bottom borders

#### **Binding**

Cut 6 strips 2 1/2" x WOF

### **Piecing Instructions**

**Step 1:** Gather one  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square and one  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square. Draw a line across the diagonal


on the Fabric E square. Lay the squares RST and stitch a scant  ${}^{1}/{}_{4}{}^{"}$  away from either side of the line. Cut apart on line to create 2 Half Square Triangles (HSTs) open and press. Repeat with the remaining Fabric E square to create a total of 4 E/I HSTs.





Repeat with all 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to create the following blocks:



**Step 2:** Gather one E/I HST and one F/I HST. Lay them RST with the seams on top of each other and Fabric F on opposite sides (see below). Draw a line on the back side of one of the HSTs perpendicular to the seam and sew a scant <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" away from either side of the line. Cut apart on line to create 2 Quarter Square Triangles (QSTs). Open and press. Square up blocks to 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>". Repeat to make 6 E/F/I QSTs. There will be one HST of each leftover - discard or save for a future project.







**Step 3:** Repeat with G/I and H/I HSTs to create a total of 6 G/H/I QSTs. There will be one HST of each leftover - discard or save for a future

project.



**Step 4:** Gather one 6 1/2" Fabric B Square and four 3 1/2" Fabric I squares. Draw a diagonal line across the back of all four Fabric I squares. Place one square on a corner as shown and stitch on the line. Trim excess 1/4" away from the line, open and press. Repeat for remaining 3 corners. Repeat to make 6 B/I Blocks.










**Step 5:** Repeat with remaining Fabric B, Fabric C and Fabric D 6 1/2" squares to create the following:



**Step 6:** Repeat Step 4 with the 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" QST blocks from Steps 2 and 3 to create the following:



**Step 7:** Gather one 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 54 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Fabric A strip and four 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Fabric I squares. Draw a diagonal line across the back of all four Fabric I squares. Place one square on a corner as shown and stitch on the line. Trim excess <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" away from the line, open and press. Repeat for remaining 3 corners. Repeat to make 4 A/I Stripe Columns.




### **Assembly Instructions**

**Step 8:** To assemble the columns, gather the blocks listed below and sew them together in the order they are listed below and press:

- 1. B/I Block
- 2. E/F/I Block
- 3. A/I Block
- 4. G/H/I Block
- 5. C/I Block
- 6. G/H/I Block
- 7. A/I Block
- 8. E/F/I Block
- 9. B/I Block

Repeat to make 3 Pieced columns.



**Step 9:** Gather the three columns from Step 8 and the four A/I Blocks from Step 7.

Sew them in the following order (noting the orientation of the stripe) and press:

- 1. A/I Stripe Column
- 2. Pieced Column
- 3. A/I Stripe Column
- 4. Pieced Column
- 5. A/I Stripe Column
- 6. Pieced Column
- 7. A/I Stripe Column



**Step 10:** Sew the 2" Fabric I side borders to the sides of the quilt. Press towards border. Sew the 2" Fabric I borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press towards border.

Woohoo! Your quilt top is now finished. Now, quilt and bind it using your preferred method. (We love double fold binding!)
